

MaryJane on Point Wall Hanging

32½" x 21¼"

YOU'LL NEED:

Fabric 1 (4150LR—redwork panel print)
½ yard for blocks, background and flying geese

Fabric 2 (4155R—red/white floral)
1 fat quarter for blocks and flying geese

Fabrics 3 and 4 (4151L—pink rose print and
4151C—red rose print)
¼ yard each fabric for flying geese

Fabric 5 (4157E—pink/white stripe)
1 fat quarter for flying geese

Fabric 6 (4153R—red/green/cream squares)
¼ yard for inside border and flying geese

Fabric 7 (4157R—red/white stripe)
½ yard for binding and flying geese

CUTTING:

Mark pieces with assigned letters. Piecing instructions will refer to letters only.

Fabric 1:

- Fussy-cut (2) 5¾" x 5¾" A squares, centering a girl in each square
- Cut (1) 11¾" x 11¾" square; cut on both diagonals to make four B triangles
- Cut (2) 6⅞" x 6⅞" squares; cut each square in half on 1 diagonal to make 4 C triangles

Fabric 2:

- Cut (4) 4⅝" x 4⅝" squares; cut each square in half on 1 diagonal to make 8 B triangles

Fabric 6:

- Trim selvage edge from one side length of fabric. Cut (2) 4¼" x 9" strips along the trimmed selvage; subcut into (3) 4¼" x 4¼" G squares
- Fussy-cut (2) 2¾" x 21½" E strips
- Fussy-cut (2) 2½" x 15½" F strips

Fabric 7:

- Cut (120") 2½" bias strips for binding

Fabric 8:

- Cut (4) 3½" x 3½" I squares

Fabrics 1, 3 and 4:

- Cut (52) total 2⅜" x 2⅜" H squares

Fabrics 2, 5 and 7:

- Cut 10 total 4¼" x 4¼" G squares



Fabric 8 (4152R—red bandana stripe)
⅛ yard for border corners

Backing 40" x 29" or 1 yard
Batting 40" x 29"

ASSEMBLING, STITCHING, AND FINISHING DETAILS:

Seam allowance: $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise noted.

RST = Right Sides Together

Refer to the Assembly Diagram for placement during piecing.

Making the Pieced Center

1. Sew a B triangle to each side of the A squares to complete the center blocks. Press seams toward B.
2. Sew D to the top right corner and C to the left top and bottom corners of one center block, making sure to pay attention to direction of the print. Press seams toward C and D.
3. Sew D to the bottom left corner and C to the right top and bottom corners of the second center block. Press seams toward C and D.
4. Join the block sections. Press seam in one direction.
5. Sew an E strip to each long side and an F strip to each end of the pieced center, press seams toward E and F strips as added.

Making Flying Geese Units

1. RST, align the edges of two matching H squares with the edges of two opposite diagonal corners of a G square. Draw a line across both small squares from corner to corner (Diagram 1).
2. Trim tips of squares where they overlap so the cut ends meet and marked lines match (Diagram 2).
3. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of drawn lines through both squares. Cut apart on marked line to divide into two units. (Diagram 3) Press seams toward the large triangle.
4. Place an H square RST on the square corner of each unit. Draw a diagonal line (Diagram 4).
5. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of drawn line of each unit. Cut on marked lines and press seams towards dark fabric to complete two flying geese units.
6. Repeat steps 1–5 to make 52 flying geese units.
7. Join flying geese units to make two 16-unit side strips. Press seams in one direction. Stitch a side strip to each long side of the pieced center. Press seams toward E.
8. Join flying geese units to make two 10-unit strips. Press seams in one direction. Stitch an I square to each end of each strip to make two end strips. Press seams toward I. Sew an end strip to each end of the pieced center. Press seams toward end strips.

FINISHING

1. Place the batting between the stitched top and backing; pin or baste layers together for quilting.
2. Quilt as desired by hand or machine; remove pins or basting.
3. Join the binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make one long strip; press seams open.
4. Fold the binding in half along length with wrong sides together to make a double layer; press.
5. Stitch binding to the right side of the quilt top with raw edges even, mitering corners and overlapping the ends.
6. Turn the binding to the back side and hand-stitch in place to finish.

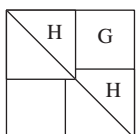

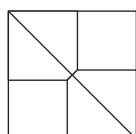

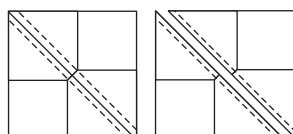

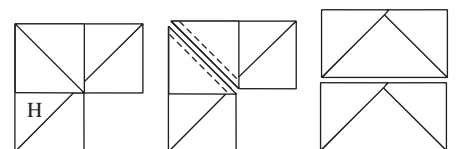

EMBELLISHMENTS (OPTIONAL)

The sample quilt has added yo-yos stitched on with buttons in the centers.

1. To make yo-yos, cut fabric circles twice the size of the desired finished size of the yo-yo plus 1/2" to turn under. For a 2" finished yo-yo, cut a 4 1/2"-diameter circle.

2. Turn the edge 1/4" to the inside all around and using a knotted thread, run a gathering stitch all around. Pull thread at ending to draw the edges into a puckered circle (Diagram 5) and knot to secure.

3. Arrange yo-yos on quilted top as desired. Stitch in place with a button in the center of each yo-yo.

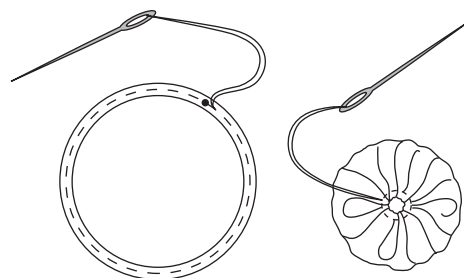
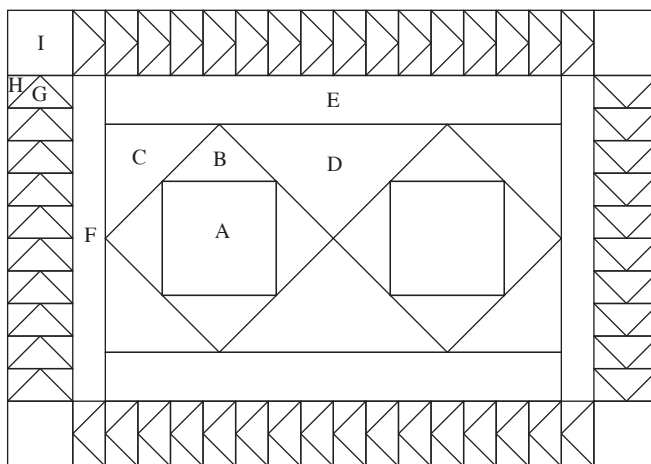
