# Three Farmgirls Wall Hanging 231/2" x 493/4"

#### **YOU'LL NEED: Fabric 1** (4219R–red farmgirl print): 1 panel (<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> yard) for blocks

**Fabric 2** (4151L–pink rose print): <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yard for sashing and outside pieced border

**Fabric 3** (4155R–red/white print): <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard for sashing squares and outside pieced border

**Fabric 4** (4152R–red bandana print): <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard for inside border

**Fabric 5** (4157R–red/white stripe): <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yard for binding and outside pieced border

**Fabrics 6, 7, 8 and 9** (4157E–pink/white stripe, 4151C–red rose print, 4150LR–redwork panel print and 4153R–red/green/cream squares): <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard each fabric for outside pieced border

Backing: 30" x 57" or 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yards Batting: 30" x 57"



# **CUTTING:**

Mark pieces with assigned letters. Piecing instructions will refer to letters only. When cutting pieces listed from Fabrics 2, 3 and 5, cut a few extra strips in varying widths from  $1\frac{1}{4}$ "- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " for outside pieced border.

## Fabric 1:

• Fussy-cut (3) 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" A squares for blocks, centering a motif in each square

Fabric 2:

- Cut (4) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" B strips
- Cut (6) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" C strips

#### Fabric 3:

• Cut (8) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" D squares

## Fabric 4:

- Cut (2) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 40<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" E strips
- Cut (2) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 18" F strips

## Fabric 5:

- Cut (160" total) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" bias strips for binding
- Fabrics 6, 7, 8 and 9:
  - Cut strips in varying widths for outside pieced border

#### ASSEMBLING, STITCHING, AND FINISHING DETAILS

Seam allowance: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" unless otherwise noted. Refer to Assembly Diagram for placement during piecing.

1. Join three A squares with four B strips to make the center row; press seams toward B.

2. Join three C strips with four D squares to make a sashing row; repeat to make two rows. Press seams toward C.

3. Sew a sashing row to each side of the center row; press seams toward sashing rows.

4. Sew an E strip to each long side and an F strip to the top and bottom; press seams toward E and F.

5. Make 46 copies of the paper-pieced block pattern. Set machine stitch length to 15 stitches per inch or 1.5.

6. Select a strip for piece 1 and pin right side up in the number 1 position on the unmarked side of the paper.

7. Place piece 2 right sides together with piece 1; stitch on the 1-2 line on the marked side of the paper. Trim excess to  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press piece 2 to the right side.

8. Repeat step 7 with pieces 3 and 4 to complete one paper-pieced block; press all pieces to the right side after stitching.

9. Repeat steps 6–8 to complete 46 blocks total. Trim the pieced blocks to  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ "; remove paper foundations.

10. Sew two strips each with 15 blocks; press seams in one direction. Trim

strips to 44<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>". Center and sew these strips to the long sides of the pieced center; press seams toward E.

11. Sew two strips each with eight blocks; press seams in one direction. Trim strips to 24". Center and sew these strips to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward F.

## FINISHING

1. Place the batting between the stitched top and backing; pin or baste layers together for quilting.

2. Quilt as desired by hand or machine; remove pins or basting.

3. Join the binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make one long strip; press seams open.

4. Fold the binding in half along length with wrong sides together to make a double layer; press.

5. Stitch binding to the right side of the quilt top with raw edges even, mitering corners and overlapping the ends.

6. Turn the binding to the back side and hand-stitch in place to finish.

## **EMBELLISHMENTS**

The sample quilt has added yo-yos stitched on with buttons in the centers. 1. To make yo-yos, cut fabric circles twice the size of the desired finished size of the yo-yo plus  $\frac{1}{2}$ " to turn under. For a 2" finished yo-yo, cut a  $\frac{4\frac{1}{2}}{-}$ diameter circle.

2. Turn the edge <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" to the inside all around and using a knotted thread, run a gathering stitch all around. Pull thread at ending to draw the edges into a puckered circle (Diagram 1) and knot to secure.

3. Arrange yo-yos on quilted top as desired. Stitch in place with a button in the center of each yo-yo to finish.
